NATURAL RESOURCE DIRECTOR

Reporting to the Lake Babine Nation Chief Operations Officer and Chief & Council and being the point of contact between Forestry, Mining, Fisheries - businesses, entities, societies, companies - and Lake Babine Nation, the Natural Resource Director shall be responsible for organizing, collecting, and presenting data pertaining to past, present and future use of Lake Babine Nation traditional territories and the effects of potential Forestry, Mining, Fisheries projects on the traditional territories and its environment.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Arrange and initiate sessions to share information with Lake Babine Nation about roles and responsibilities of all Forestry, Mining, Fisheries businesses, entities, societies, companies. To meet with traditional land owners to identify territories, land use, activities and prioritize plan of action.
- Develop report(s) to provide to Chief & Council, members and all affiliated with Forestry, Lands, Lakes for update on the past, present, and future use of the land, include any potential project effects on the land, environment, or culture or other related concerns raised by the members in the study. The report will also include any recommendations that the members contribute to mitigate potential project affects.
- Ensure that Provincial / Territorial, Federal governments all those affiliated with Forestry, Mining, Fisheries fulfill obligations.
- Liaises with funding agents, the Chief Operations Officer will work with Natural Resource Director to develop a budget.
- Meets periodically with the Chief Operations Officer and the Nation's Chief Finance Officer to monitor and maintain financial control of the budgets.
- Performs other related duties as, and when, requested by the Lake Babine Nation Chief Operations Officer and Chief & Council.
