This is an exciting opportunity to be the eyes and ears of Lake Babine Nation throughout our Territory. Yintah Guardians will have a diversity of responsibilities including gathering data related to the past, present and future of LBN's yintah, monitoring all land-users in our Territory, including industrial and recreational activities, and supporting our wildlife and fisheries stewardship initiatives.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Gather, record, organize and report on data related to a variety of LBN yintah stewardship initiatives.
- Monitor industrial and recreational activities in the Territory for compliance with provincial, federal and Nedut'en legal requirements.
- Actively participate in stewardship initiatives such as habitat restoration, predator management, and other "hands-on" activities.
- Support the co-ordination of related yintah projects, programs, and initiatives.
- Communicate with members, especially elders, knowledge keepers, hereditary chiefs and youth, and include their knowledge in the effective stewardship of our yintah.
- Communicate with anglers, hunters, and other recreational users of LBN Territory, and educate them about 'anuh niwh k'ana'h (our ways).
- Co-ordinate monitoring efforts with the Conservation Officer Service and the Department of Fisheries and Oceans.
- Participate in, and contribute to, Lake Babine's Fisheries and Wildlife Advisory Teams.
- Develop reports for staff in the Natural Resource department and Chief and Council as required.
- Perform other related duties as, and when, requested by the yintah guardian supervisor.

- Extensive experience operating a boat & motor
- Proven ability to act safely and effectively in stressful environments.
