- Able to follow verbal and written instructions.
- Pleasure Craft Operator's Certificate for stream survey crew and stream walk crew.
- Able to live in camp if applying for sockeye smolt or Babine fence programs.

Babine Sockeye Smolt Enumeration	A mark-recapture study to estimate smolts migrating out of Babine watershed	Babine camp (near km 58 of the Nilkitkwa Forest Service Road – 2 hr drive from Burns Lake)	May 5 – June 15
Cross Cr Fry Trapping Project	A fry trap to capture sockeye fry and count and sample them	Near Pendleton Bay BC about a 30-minute drive from Burns Lake	Construct and install fence end of April. Operate fence May 5 to about June 10
Babine River Fish Counting Fence	Count all species of salmon spawners swimming past the fence	Babine camp	July 10 – Sept 30
Wild Sockeye Stream Counts	Walk streams to count sockeye	Burns Lake	July 25 – Sept 30
Stream Survey Crew	Conduct stream surveys to determine quality and quantity of fish habitat. Download temperature loggers	Burns Lake area – streams are accessed by boat	August
Technical Assistant	Trailer boats to various sites, do camp grocery shopping, enter data onto Excel spreadsheets, do gear and equipment pick-ups and take to Babine camp and assist with projects as needed	Located in either Burns Lake or Smithers	May - September
